This course aims to assist students to acquire three types of competence which are necessary for interacting with Japanese speakers in everyday contact situations, namely linguistic competence, sociolinguistic competence and socio-cultural competence.

In the class, besides activities that focus on understanding, preparation and practice for the interaction in Japanese, there will also be several "performance activities" (abbreviated as PA) with the help of Japanese speakers as opportunities for authentic use of Japanese.

This course is targeted at students who have completed one third of the beginner's level (approx. JLPT N5). This course aims to familiarize students with interacting with native Japanese speakers and enable them to interact in daily life and university life situations. In the class, we will think of when and in what context we can use the grammar that students have learned so far.

It also has a lot of pair or group work. Through interacting with native speakers, students will review their performance and acquire more practical competence.

Course Contents (tentative)

1. Simple email writing

2. Conversations about hobbies and favorite food etc. with Japanese university students

3. Interviewing Japanese university students

(e.g. recommended places, young people's language)

4. Saying thank you to your close friends

*The contents may be changed depending on the number of participants.

The target of this course is the Performance Activity (PA) which is the compilation of what

students have learned. Students will not only do some conversation practice using some

sentence patterns but also study new expressions useful for the PA and conversation

strategies. Students will practice together with other students and active class participation is

expected.

For the PA, students will set a challenging goal along with the target set by the instructor and

reflect on themselves about what they were and were not able to do by listening to and

reviewing the recordings of the PA. The recordings and reflection sheets will be checked by

the instructor.

Course Description

This course aims to assist students to acquire three types of competence which are necessary for interacting with Japanese speakers in everyday contact situations, namely linguistic competence, sociolinguistic competence and socio-cultural competence.

In the class, besides activities that focus on understanding, preparation and practice for the interaction in Japanese, there will also be several "performance activities" (abbreviated as PA) with the help of Japanese speakers as opportunities for authentic use of Japanese.

This course is targeted at students who have completed half of the beginner's level (approx. JLPT N5-N4). Students are expected to be able to express a certain amount of their feelings and opinions about themselves and familiar topics using acquired knowledge with the help of a conversation partner.

Three or four topics will be covered throughout the semester. Each topic aims to do the Performance Activity (PA) that involves actual interaction with Japanese speakers. This course will have a lot of pair work and group work, therefore active participation is expected. Students will reflect on their performance after each PA and think of the attainments and challenges. The evaluation will be made comprehensively based on the participation, assignments, reports and the PA. The contents may change depending on the number of participants.

Course Contents (tentative)

1. Self-introduction

Introduce yourself to a person who you meet for the first time and talk about your own university and familiar topics. Get information about the conversation partner and learn how to become good friends with.

2. Chatting with friends

Chat with Japanese university students about your hobbies and daily life. Find something in common or differences and exchange information about things that are popular with friends.

3. Getting advices for presentation

Research and have a presentation about the appeal of your country. Learn how to get advice to improve your presentation.

4. Email/SNS writing

Write a message in Japanese and send it by using emails and SNS. Practice how to write casual expressions, formal email style and set phrases.

Course Description

This course aims to assist students to acquire three types of competence which are necessary for interacting with Japanese speakers in everyday contact situations, namely linguistic competence, sociolinguistic competence and socio-cultural competence.

In the class, besides activities that focus on understanding, preparation and practice for the interaction in Japanese, there will also be several "performance activities" (abbreviated as PA) with the help of Japanese speakers as opportunities for authentic use of Japanese.

This course is targeted at students who have completed the beginner's level (approx. JLPT N4-N3). It aims to enable students to deliver their feelings and thoughts and keep relatively longer conversations about daily life and university life. It also includes thinking about somewhat abstract concepts such as society, culture and career in their future, making presentations with some materials and expressing their opinions. Students will learn a variety of styles in Japanese conversation such as formal expressions to communicate with others who meet for the first time or university's professors and also casual expressions with friends in order to use suitable expressions by scenes. Communicative strategies to express what they want to say and to make smooth conversation will also be covered. Students will

think about the society and culture and deepen their understanding through several activities with classmates, Japanese students, former students of the program etc.

Course Contents (tentative)

A new topic will be introduced every two to three weeks. Students will discuss what they know about the topic in class. After that, students will learn necessary knowledge and skills for PA, decide the contents according to their interests and prepare. Then an authentic PA with the help of Japanese volunteers will take place.

PA includes discussion, presentation, conversation, interview etc. After the PA, students will reflect on their process and outcome.

♦Topics

- 1. Introducing each other's hometown, university and major.
- 2. Writing formal emails to the university faculty/staff or person in working places.
- 3. Researching your interested things about Japan, making interviews, presenting the result.
- 4. Chatting with friends and using SNS to get closer.
- 5. Working in a group, making ideas of a new application and giving a presentation.
- 6. Interviewing a former student of the program.

Activities of "speaking" and "listening" may be included as needed.

Course Contents (tentative)

Students will learn reading strategy to gain new information and knowledge and writing strategy to express their thought and understanding in organized passages.

Specifically, the following topics will be covered expecting students to learn a lot and spend fruitful time at university.
